There are people who think that countries and governments waste their money when they send astronauts into space. **They** say that the money should be used to improve the quality of life on earth. What they might not know is that life on earth has already been improved by missions into space. Technology, materials, devices, and fabrics that were first developed for use in space are now part of our everyday lives. These items are called "spin-offs"*

For example, one spin-off of space technology has made it quicker to buy things at stores. The **bar codes** that are used on today's packages came from the NASA space programme. Now, we all benefit because a price can be scanned instantly by a laser. Really, it has saved a lot of time and effort.

NASA has also developed various materials that we now find around us every day. The light metals used in modern tennis rackets are one example. Also, NASA developed metals that have a "memory". When these metal are bent, they return to their original shape. We now use these metals in eyeglasses frames to make them flexible and unbreakable. Glasses also utilize another NASA development: scratch-resistant lenses. Finally, the shock-absorbing materials originally developed for moon boots are now used in all kinds of athletic shoes.

Also, the smoke detector comes from technology originally used in the Skylab spacecraft in the early 1970s. Millions of homes, as well as motel and hotel rooms, now have these devices installed. They are cheap, small sensors that sound an alarm if smoke is present. Countless lives have been saved thanks to the early warning provided by smoke detectors.

Homes now use thin insulation* that was first developed for use in space. This insulation is more efficient and easier to install than traditional insulation. We also wrap this kind of insulation around our water heaters to make them more efficient. Ultra-light fabrics designed in the space programme are now used in the roof of Silverdome sports arena in Detroit, Michigan, and in the roof of the airport in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Like the smoke detector, space fabrics help save lives. Beta Glass, a fabric made by NASA, is now used in fireproof clothing worn by firefighters.

These are only a few of the 30,000 innovations from space that benefit our lives on Earth. There will be people who oppose exploration, but if they say it is a waste of money, remind them that their way of life is possible due to products from space.
