The modern Olympic Games are the leading international sporting event featuring summer and winter sports competitions in which thousands of athletes across the planet participate in a variety of competitions. The Olympic Games are considered to be the world's foremost sports competition with more than 200 nations participating. *They* are held every four years, with the summer and winter games alternating by occurring every four years but two years apart. Their creation was inspired by the ancient Olympic Games, which were held in Olympia, Greece, from the 8th century BC to the 4th century AD.

Baron Pierre de Coubertin founded the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in 1894. It is the governing body of the Olympic Movement, with the Olympic Charter defining its structure and authority. The growing importance of mass media created the issue of corporate sponsorship and commercialization of the Games. World wars led to the cancellation of the 1916, 1940, and 1944 Games. Large boycotts during the Cold War limited participation in the 1980 and 1984 Games.

The <u>evolution</u> of the Olympic Movement during the 20th and 21st centuries has resulted in several changes to the Olympic Games. Some of these adjustments include the creation of the Winter Olympic Games for ice and winter sports, the Paralympic Games for athletes with a disability, and the Youth Olympic Games for teenage athletes. The IOC has had to adapt to a variety of economic, political, and technological advancements. As a result, the Olympics has shifted away from pure amateurism, as envisioned by Coubertin, to allowing participation of professional athletes.

The Olympic Movement consists of international sports federations, National Olympic Committees, and organizing committees for each specific Olympic Games. As the decision-making body, the IOC is responsible for choosing the host city for each game, and organizes and funds the games according to the Olympic Charter. The IOC also determines the Olympic program, consisting of the sports to be contested at the Games. Moreover, it chooses the rituals and symbols, such as the Olympic flag and torch, as well as the opening and closing ceremonies. Over 13,000 athletes compete at the summer and Winter Olympic Games in 33 different sports and nearly 400 events. The first, second and third place finishers in each event receive Olympic medals: gold, silver, and bronze, respectively.

Sir William Herschel is generally thought to be the first European to realize that fingerprints were <u>unique</u> to each person. As he looked at more and more handprints, he started to believe that fingerprints were unique; Herschel kept track of his own fingerprints over his entire lifetime.

Dr. Henry Faulds, a British surgeon, began studying the ridges (furrows) on fingertips in the 1870s and he devised, a system of classifying fingerprints. Using Henry Faulds's findings, Galton published a major book on classifying fingerprints based on arches, loops, and whorls. His work with Sir Edward Henry on fingerprint classification was the basis of a classification system which is still used by law enforcement agencies in English–speaking countries.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation now uses a variation of the Galton– Henry system. Although the use of fingerprinting in identification originated in Britain. In 1924, two large fingerprint collections were combined to form the foundation of the Identification Division of the FBI. Within the Identification Division, the Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification Systems can search and find fingerprints anywhere in the United States within thirty minutes.

About one in six Americans has fingerprints on file with the FBI. But not all the fingerprints are related to criminal investigations. People need to have their fingerprints taken for many other reasons. People have their fingerprints taken for employment, licenses, and adoption. For example, when people want to work for the governments in classified, secret jobs, their fingerprints are checked to be sure they do not have a criminal background. When prospective parents adopt a child, their fingerprints are matched against those of all criminals for the safety of the child.
